AURORA COUNTY COMMISSIONER PROCEEDINGS

December 19, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM by Chairman Clyde Dethlefsen, with Travis Clark, John Paul Studeny, Roger Hanten, and Randy Niles present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

There was no public input.

The agenda was amended by adding SD511 App, stove at Community/4-H building, set temporary liquor license hearing, and Charles Mix County jail contract. A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Clark to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Niles to approve the minutes from the December 5th meeting. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Hanten, seconded by Niles to approve the following expense budget adjustments.

Highway Superintendent Vissia and Highway Secretary Beckman were present for the highway report.

Discussion was held on the bill from Dakota Pro Striping for the oil road south of White Lake. Vissia reported that he measured the areas that were bad and figured there was approximately 13,000 running feet that needed to be redone. The amount of \$1,194 will be deducted from the original bill, which was \$4,300, A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to pay Dakota Pro Striping \$3,107 for the portion of the striping that is good and pay the remaining balance of \$1,194 in the spring contingent upon the contractor returns to fix it. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Hanten to approve the final payment to BX Civil & Construction in the amount of \$7,701.10 for project BRO 8002(00)22-4, PCN 08WT for structure # 02-021-260 (Breukelman Bridge. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to approve a payment to BX Civil & Construction in the amount of \$45,098.91 for project BRO 8000,(00)22-5, PCN 08WV for structure # 02-213-070 (Erickson Bridge).

Motion carried all voting aye.

Hanten noted there are some trees near Wilmarth that need to be removed and stated if they are not removed, the snow will catch there and cause drifts. Vissia said they are planning to cut trees next week.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Niles to approve a Plat of Lot 2 of Horstmeyer Farm First Addition in the SW ¼ of Section 27, T 104 N, R 64 West of the 5th PM, Aurora County, South Dakota. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Hanten to approve a Plat of Tract A of Persson Addition in the SW ¹/₄ of Section 30, T 101 N, R 63 West of the 5th PM, Aurora County, South Dakota. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to accept the bid from Nutrien for Amine, Tordon 22, Reign Drift, and accept the bid from Helena for the Activator and Venue and table the bid for the Veg-A-Kill until more information can be obtained as to what would be in the best interest for the County. Motion carried all voting aye.

States Attorney Rachel Mairose and Register of Deeds Arlene Koch met with the Board to discuss the small triangular piece of property in White Lake along Highway 16. Arlene informed the Commission that the County cannot deed these lots to anyone because they are highway lots. States Attorney Mairose and Register of Deeds Koch suggested leasing it for haying purposes. Mairose said she would draw up a lease, but recommended letting the City of White Lake know what our plans are. Arlene told the Board that she will meet with the City of White Lake and inform them of what the County is wanting to do.

States Attorney Mairose informed the Commission a deed that was filed back in 1971 had an incorrect legal description. A corrective deed is needed get the legal description right for the Deed by County to Land Acquired by Tax Proceedings dated the 5th day of May, 1971 and recorded in Book 47 of Deeds, Page 33, in the Office of the Register of Deeds Office. A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the corrective deed. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Niles to purchase a new stove for the Community/4-H Building from Central Electric in the amount of \$659. Motion carried all voting aye. The new stove will replace the one that is broken.

Weed Supervisor Kehn reported back to the Commission that he had called both Helena and Nutrien about the chemical equivalent to Veg-A-Kill. After comparing the two from the information obtained and noting that the cost per acre was lower with the Plainview, a motion was made by Clark, and seconded by Hanten to try the Plainview SC from Nutrien for a year and compare it to the areas that were sprayed this year with Veg-A-Kill and see if it is equivalent. Motion carried all voting aye.

Emergency Manager Kehn informed the Commission that the County has been approved to have access to input information into the 511 website for road closures. He told the Commission that when the County uploads road closures on the website it will transfer that information into google maps, etc. There were instances in the last few years where those that were using google maps were directed to take some of the off roads when Interstate 90 was

closed and ended up getting stuck or stranded. This will be very helpful for those traveling that do not live in the area.

A motion was made by Clark, seconded by Studeny to authorize the law enforcement officers in the Sheriff's office and the County Emergency Manager to make the decision to close county roads due to bad weather. Motion carried all voting aye.

A motion was made by Studeny, seconded by Hanten to approve the Charles Mix County Jail Contract for 2025 at \$90.00 per prisoner day. Motion carried all voting aye.

Veterans Officer Audrey Chapman informed the Commission the veterans appreciation day held on November 14th went over well. She had over 30 veterans come in and approximately 75% had not been into the office before. Audrey also informed the Commission that her class schedule at DWU changed for the upcoming semester and she will be adjusting her hours for the office. She told the Commission she has been letting the veterans know that her hours will be from 10:30 AM to 4:30 PM on both Thursday and Friday of each week

A motion was made by Niles, seconded by Hanten to file reports and pay the bills as listed below. Motion carried all voting aye.
